EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 34
Series of 2020.

AN ORDER DECLARING THE ENTIRE CITY OF GINGOOG UNDER MODIFIED GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE (MGCQ) EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2020 UP TO JUNE 15, 2020 PURSUANT TO THE MANDATE OF THE INTER-AGENCY TASK FORCE UNDER IATF RESOLUTION NO. 40 SERIES OF 2020.

WHEREAS, the President has placed the entire country under the State of Public Health Emergency due to the alarming threats posed by the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) through Proclamation No. 922;

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, President Rodrigo R. Duterte has declared a State of Calamity throughout the Philippines due to Coronavirus disease through Proclamation No. 929;

WHEREAS, on the noon of March 21, 2020, the entire City of Gingoog was placed under General Community Quarantine through Executive Order No. 21 series of 2020 and was extended by Executive Order No. 26 series of 2020 and was further extended by Executive Order No. 28 series of 2020 and by Executive Order No. 33 series of 2020 up to May 31, 2020;

WHEREAS, based on the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-MEID) Resolution No. 40 series of 2020 dated May 27, 2020, it has classified the province of Misamis Oriental and the rest of Northern Mindanao as one of the "low risk" areas and shall be placed under Modified General Community Quarantine beginning 01 June 2020 up to 15 June 2020;

WHEREAS, in compliance with the said Resolution, it is imperative upon the city government to declare a Modified General Community Quarantine in the entire City of Gingoog.

NOW, THEREFORE, I ERICK G. CAÑOSA, by the virtue of the power vested in me by law as City Mayor of Gingoog, do hereby issue this Executive Order and declare the following:

Section 1: DECLARATION. It is hereby declared that the entire City of Gingoog is placed under Modified General Community Quarantine beginning June 1, 2020 up to June 15, 2020 unless extended upon the recommendation of the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) or by higher authorities.

Section 2. POLICIES AND GUIDELINES GOVERNING THE MODIFIED GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE. Based on the Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine as approved and released by the IATF on May 15, 2020 which was amended through Resolution No. 38, series of 2020 dated May 22, 2020, the following shall serve as the new guidelines, to wit:

1. Minimum public health standards shall be complied with at all times for the duration of the MGCQ.
2. All persons shall now be allowed outside their residence.
3. Indoor and Outdoor non-contact sports and other forms of exercise such as but not limited to walking, jogging, running, biking, golf, swimming, tennis, badminton, equestrian, and skateboarding are allowed. Provided, that the minimum public health standards such as the wearing of masks and the maintenance of social distancing protocols, and no sharing of equipment where applicable are observed.
4. Mass gathering such as but not limited to, movie screenings, concerts, sporting events, and other entertainment activities, community assemblies, and non-essential work gatherings shall be allowed provided that participants shall be limited to fifty percent (50%) of the venue or seating capacity. Religious gatherings shall be allowed under such guidelines as may be declared through subsequent issuances of the IATF.
5. Residential or face-to-face classes may be conducted in Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) provided there is strict compliance with minimum health standards, consultation with local government units, and compliance with guidelines set by CHED. HEI activities that involve mass gathering of students shall continue to be prohibited.

For K-12 Basic Education, the Basic Education Learning Continuity Plan of the DepEd shall be adopted.

6. Work in all public and private offices shall be allowed to resume physical work in full capacity with alternative arrangements for persons who are sixty (60) years old and above, those with immunodeficiency, comorbidities, or other health risks, and pregnant women.

7. The road, rail, maritime, and aviation sectors of public transportation shall be allowed to operate at the capacity in accordance with guidelines issued by the DOTr. Provided, that in all public transports, a strict one (1) meter distance between passengers shall be observed and appropriate engineering controls are in place.
8. Private transportation shall be allowed subject to the guidelines provided by DOTr.
9. All public and private construction projects shall be allowed, but with strict compliance to the issued construction safety guidelines for the implementation of infrastructure projects during the COVID-19 pandemic by the DPWH.
10. Except as otherwise provided below, all permitted establishments and activities under Category I-IV of Section 4(6) and in pertinent Section of this Omnibus Guidelines shall be allowed to operate or be undertaken at full operational capacity:
 - A. Barber shops, salons, and other personal care service establishments, shall be allowed to operate at a maximum of fifty percent (50%) of venue capacity;
 - B. Dine-in service in food retail establishments such as supermarkets, grocery stores, and food preparation establishments, at a maximum of fifty percent (50%) seating capacity; and
 - C. Other Category IV and all other establishments not permitted to operate under previous Sections of these guidelines, at a maximum of fifty percent (50%) operational capacity.
11. Work in government offices may be at full operational capacity, or under such alternative work arrangements as agencies may deem appropriate in accordance with the relevant rules and regulations issued by the Civil Service Commission (CSC).
12. Accredited diplomatic missions and international organizations may resume full operations.

Section 3. PROVISIONS ON CURFEW, LIQUOR BAN AND WEARING OF FACEMASKS.

- a. The new city-wide curfew hours for adults shall be from 10 pm to 4 am while for minors the new curfew hours shall be from 6pm to 5am;
- b. Except during curfew hours (10pm to 4am), business establishments may sell liquors, alcoholic and intoxicating beverages to all persons of legal age. However, it is still prohibited for anyone to drink or consume liquor and alcoholic beverages in public places;
- c. The order mandating every person within the territorial jurisdiction of Gingoog City to wear facemask at all times when going out of their residences, at the workplace, entering government offices and while in public places under Executive Order No. 25 series of 2020 shall continue to be in full force and effect until the State of Public Health Emergency shall be lifted or withdrawn by the President or by other higher authorities. The mandatory wearing of facemask is also provided under City Ordinance No. 2020-353 as amended;

Section 4. RE-OPENING OF SOME PUBLIC PLACES AND ESTABLISHMENTS. The Pahayahay sa Pantalan and the Public Plaza shall be re-open to the public, except during curfew hours. Strict implementation of the minimum health standards shall be imposed. As such, wearing of facemask and physical distancing shall be observed at all times and the sharing of food and utensils should be avoided.

Likewise, Internet cafes, KTV bars, restaurants and other similar establishments may now resume their operations provided, strict compliance of the required minimum health standards and other protocols set by the IATF shall be complied with at all times.

Section 5. MISCELLANEOUS.

- a. All other issuances or resolutions that have been issued or to be issued by the IATF with regards to the implementation of the Modified General Community Quarantine are also deemed adopted and shall also be made an integral part of this Order;
- b. Provisions of Executive Order Nos. 20, 21, 23, and 25, all series of 2020 as well as the provisions of City Government of Gingoog Guidelines numbers 1 to 5 for the prevention of coronavirus disease (COVID-19) which are not in conflict with this Order are hereby adopted and shall form an integral part hereof.


Section 6: PENALTY CLAUSE: Any violations hereof shall be dealt with under existing laws and ordinances.

Section 7: REPEALING CLAUSE: Any Executive Order not consistent with this Order is hereby amended or repealed.

Section 8: SEPARABILITY CLAUSE: In case any provision of this Order shall be declared invalid, illegal or unenforceable by higher authorities or by the Courts, the validity, legality, and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not in any way be affected or impaired.

Section 9: EFFECTIVITY: This Executive Order shall take effect on the date and time abovementioned.
